- 1 The fool says in his heart, "There is no God." They are corrupt, doing abominable iniquity; there is <u>NONE</u> who does good.
- 2 God looks down from heaven on the children of man to see if there are any who understand, who seek after God.
- 3 They have <u>ALL</u> fallen away; together they have become corrupt; there is <u>NONE</u> who does good, not even one.

[Psalm 53:1-3]

There is so much more. Yes, the fourth constant is the fact that **none does good** and **all have fallen away**. In short, people do bad things and say bad things, all the time. People have a propensity for sin; to find pleasure outside of God. People define, determine, distribute and defend their own truth. 6 Oh, that salvation for Israel would come out of Zion! When God restores the fortunes of his people, let Jacob rejoice, let Israel be glad.

And God has restored our fortunes. He has done so through Jesus Christ. Without Jesus, me being a killjoy will be the least of your worries. But with Jesus, joy will never be killed but rather will be eternal. The Good News is that salvation does not come from you, because of the above stated fourth constant. Salvation comes from God, and his name is Jesus. Let us rejoice and be glad. In Jesus' name, Amen.
