If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.

- 2 Chronicles 7:14



And as they were stoning Stephen, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." And falling to his knees he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

And Saul approved of his execution.

And there arose on that day a great persecution against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles. Devout men buried Stephen and made great lamentation over him. But Saul was ravaging the church, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison. [Acts 7:59-8:3]

How would you respond if this were our reality? Truth be told, you probably struggle to imagine what this would be like because we live in a free country where we can freely practice our religion. We get up on Sunday mornings, put on our Sunday finest and go to a dedicated building with a big cross on top, signifying to everyone that this is a place of worship. We sit in comfortable pews without worrying about the secret police storming our building to haul us off to prison. We sing praises to our awesome God and can freely talk about Jesus in public. And many have no idea how good they have it. But this scene in Acts is not just a picture of the first century church, but also reality for many Christians around the world. You see, there are secret churches that exist today, many in communist and Muslim controlled countries. They meet in fear and trembling, wondering if they will be found out. But they meet and worship boldly because of the God who has saved them through Jesus Christ.

But why am I writing about this? I write this partly because our confirmation students had some classes about the church as we talked about the persecuted versus the free church, and thus this is all fresh on my mind. But I am also writing about this because I wonder if we have become too comfortable in our faith. If push came to shove, what would you do? What if the government all of a sudden outlawed Christianity and, say, Islam became the law of the land, would you push back and risk your life to worship our God through Jesus Christ? We will probably never know, but yet, I cannot help but wonder.

And so, I am going to be praying for the persecuted church around the world. Would you please join me in doing so? Will you also join me in praying that God would deepen our faith and the faith of the Church in the free world so that God can be more brightly glorified. Though we may "have it good" now, let us remember, that is not the point of our lives. The point is proclaiming the hope that God's children will "have it good" with Him forever through Jesus Christ. May the church become uncomfortable with our comfort. Amen.

There were a few upcoming things that were brought to my attention when I joined council in January. And one of the events, was Guest Night in September. Of course, in January, I didn't give it much thought right away, but as the months went on and I had a good idea of what Guest Night's goal and purpose was, I only had one person in mind that I thought would be a great Guest Speaker.

Kathy Mathahs, owner of Corner Pumpkin Patch. When I asked Kathy to speak, she noted she was not the best public speaker, but she also knew that if this can reflect the glory to God, she was happy to do her best! Kathy and Jeff Mathahs – Josh's aunt and uncle, started the Pumpkin Patch in 2023. It was a great location for them, as the farming operation spans from Ventura to Thompson, the machine shed had great storage, a living space, office and even a kitchen. Jeff and Kathy had a vision for their Pumpkin Patch, and that was to raise funds to build a well in Uganda – by selling their pumpkins, One pumpkin at a time! This mission is known as Hope 4 Kids International, and it brings clean and sustainable water to a village where its desperately needed. They knew they might not raise enough money right away, but as

they wrapped up the second year, they were able to meet their goal and the well was provided.

We had a great turn out with our Guest Night on September 3 with 55 in attendance, and we were able to raise \$392 which we donated to Hope 4 Kids. In addition to Kathy speaking, those in attendance were able to make a craft on a wooden pumpkin design and everyone was encouraged to get creative as they listened to Kathy's message about faith, fellowship and purpose!

- We are exploring possibilities of a timer for ringing the church bell before worship. Looking at parts totaling about \$200.
- The electronic piano is connected to the sound system, but Thomas will do some tracing and investigating
 to figure out why some of the mic ports at the altar aren't working. This affects the lectern microphone.
 Will also work on adjusting sound coming from the speakers while electric piano is playing.

Property

- Larry will coordinate with Susan for ordering new blinds for Pastor's office. We approved \$1,100 for new blinds at the last meeting.
- The toilet in the Narthex is fixed.
- Planning to install a small window replacement to stop water leaking into the parsonage. This is by a window well on the northeast corner. Looking at pulling the bush out in front of it. Hope to complete this Friday, September 12.

Quote for new ovens would total \$2,500 with some incidentals to add in to make them fit correctly and
look good cosmetically. The ladies group has offered to cash in a CD valued at \$2,000 to go toward ovens. The Schwartz funeral donated \$200. We still have this listed on the Make a Difference projects to
fulfill the remaining balance if anyone is interested in donating to this project.
