PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I hope everyone is recovering from the busy summer we're wrapping up! We're looking forward to school starting back up and getting back in the groove of things in BC. We are happy to announce the electrical panel project is completed as of August. This will be great for our church moving forward, and we are so thankful for everyone that contributed. We were also blessed to have received the Anonymous Fund grant that helped make this possible for our church. Another item on the list of summer updates was the parsonage air conditioner and furnace. We've had quite the troubles with these units over the last couple of years and have skated by, but it was time for a full replacement. The next (and hopefully the last this year) on our to -do list will be the parsonage bathroom remodel. We're very thankful for pastor Eric and his family and want to make them as comfortable as possible in their home. I can't thank them enough for toughing it out for a week without air conditioning during one of the hottest stretches of the summer!

As most of you probably notice in our weekly bulletin, our YTD offering is behind our budgeted offering for this point in the year. The difference between the two isn't all that daunting yet, however it doesn't reflect perfectly. We budget an annual \$16k for property repairs and maintenance. Unfortunately, we have soared past this number again this year, with electrical panels coming in at \$23k, AC and furnace at just over \$6k, and bathroom remodel at \$3k. With all that added to the property budget, it is clear we are well behind on giving.

I had a visit with someone awhile back who was struggling with a particular person. This person was saying things to them that were untrue and mean. As she spoke with me, tears started forming, and she needed to pause to compose herself. That was my opportunity to remind her who she is in Christ; that it is Him who defines her, not this mean-speaking person. She was letting those negative comments and untrue accusations consume her thoughts when her thoughts ought to be on our awesome God. What/Who you choose to dwell upon and consume your thinking becomes your god and thus stakes it territory in your heart.

Later, I began to think about that visit. I started thinking about myself and what/who I choose to consume my thoughts. Have you ever thought about that (no, not mine but yours)? For example, when you are bored, what do you do? Who do you think about? Do you naturally turn to social media to peruse what others are doing or thinking? Do you go to YouTube to watch some videos? Do you surf the web for nothing in particular? Do you read your favorite news source? How do you pass the time when you are bored? None of those activities that I named are necessarily bad, and in no way am I calling you to boycott them, but what consumes you is your god.

And I am far from perfect. I enjoy perusing social media and watching YouTube clips. I waste time like everyone else, and my confession here does not mean that I found a way to combat my wasteful tendencies. It has, though, got me thinking. When I experience a lull in my day, instead of going to Facebook, I pray (sometimes). Instead of looking at a YouTube clip, I have opened my Bible app (sometimes). Like I said, I am not perfect, but I am trying to reorient my thinking. And so, I challenge you to think about your thinking. What consumes you? Who consumes you? And how could you begin to reorient your thinking to be more and more on God? For you see, the depths of God's glory and majesty and beauty can never be reached, therefore you will never get bored thinking about our awesome God, because let me tell you, He loves thinking about you.

Secretary's Report

President's report

- Pastor Eric and Derek have been discussing the process of new members. The by-laws would be amended, not the
 constitution. It would require a congregation meeting. Can be proposed at the annual meeting. We would like to add
 the By-laws to the church website.

Property

- Circuit for the outside lights is in process.
- Landscaping around flagpole. This project has been cancelled at this time.
- Landscaping at parsonage: bushes on north side look great! Thank you, Darryl, and everyone that helped!
- Update on remodeling of the bathrooms in the parsonage. Project was approved last meeting. Upstairs bathroom project is still in the works. Motion was made to continue with upstairs bathroom remodel that was approved. Shower panel was installed in the downstairs bathroom.
- Electrical still isn't finished but should be finished next week.
- The AC and furnace were replaced in parsonage: \$6,300.

Worship

- Communion Server sign-up sheet was passed around.
- Outdoor service on August 25th which will also be blessing of the backpacks. Each child will receive a bookbag tag.
- The August accompanist schedule is different because one is gone part of the month.
- Pastor Eric gave the committee upcoming dates on the calendar to keep in mind.

Pastor's Report

Worship

Office Report

- Susan has been updating QuickBooks weekly, sometimes daily, to make sure we have the most accurate information. It also makes reconciliation quick at month end.
- Our bulletins and monthly newsletters are now created in Publisher instead of Word. Publisher is easier to navigate and to design within the software.
- Susan is working on updating Servant Keeper. This will be an ongoing process, but she wanted to get it ready for mailing newsletters. As of now, we have 213 families within Servant Keeper and of those, 120 families are on the list for mailing the newsletter. Susan had a couple requests by members to continue receiving the Newsletter by e-mail. There is a way to do that within the Servant Keeper database so it should be relatively easy. Susan plans to mail the September newsletter. Mailing out the newsletters will be a little more time consuming and will need to be mailed out 3-4 days before the end of the month so newsletter deadlines may have to be moved up.
- Susan can't believe it's been almost 3 months since she's started. The time has flown by and summer has flown by
 with it! Susan has been enjoying her time at the church. Pastor Eric and the council have been easy to work with.
 Everyone, including the congregation, has been very kind.


