That very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and they were talking with each other about all these things that had happened, (Luke 24:13-14)

I have been thinking about these verses and even wrote a devotional about them recently. These verses come from the "Road to Emmaus" narrative in Luke 24. This is the account of two disciples heading to Emmaus after that first Easter Sunday. They had just learned that Jesus' tomb was empty and that some angels told the women that Jesus was alive. Of course this did not make sense. And so off they go, discussing the events of the day without any understanding of what this all meant. In a sense, they were heading in the wrong direction when all the action was happening in Jerusalem.

What I like about this text is that even though they are heading in the wrong direction, Jesus does not just show up, reveal himself, and then command them to return. Rather, Jesus shows up and walks with them as they head in the wrong direction. Jesus meets them where they are at and gives us an example.

We encounter people every day who are heading in the wrong direction. You probably know people at work, in your neighborhood, in your family, or in your social circles who are heading to their Emmaus. They say they are "spiritual" but really, there is no connection with the Savior. They are "good" people, but the Spirit is not working in them to bring God glory. They may even attend a church periodically, but there is no relationship with the Father.

Therefore, when people are heading to "Emmaus", trying to drag them to "Jerusalem" is not effective. We need to employ Jesus' method, meeting people where they are at. Consider the four E's:

- (1) **Engage** people in relationships. Earn the right to be heard. This step could take months or years, but it is vitally important to be patient here.
- (2) **Enlighten** people with the Gospel. Do this through words and actions. Tangibly show them the love of Christ. If you have earned the right to be heard, then they will take notice, and may even say something.
- (3) **Enable** people to grow in their faith. You do this through honoring their questions and encouraging them to seek Jesus. Help them pray, read the Bible, etc. Show them what it means to be a follower of Jesus.
- (4) **Empower** them to create disciples. Help them get involved in ministry. Walk with them. Do not simply turn them loose without guidance.

The actual day of Easter is in our rearview mirror, but the Good News of Easter is now and always.

Go out on the road and meet people where they are at, bringing glory to God.

Amen!

Megan Ostermann and I have spent the last seven weeks covering the Lenten season and the special events that took place during those 40 days with our 1st/2nd graders. Two weeks ago, we discussed Maundy Thursday, and had our own version of the last supper with sparking juice, bread and grapes. The following week we talked about Good Friday and the kids took home some treats that represented the lesson. The Sunday we discussed Easter, the kids enjoyed eating fresh donuts and creating empty tombs out of them! Along with all the different activities we had the children do each Sunday, they also had a specific page to fill out that correlated with those special Lent events. We have a fun group of kids and we've enjoyed watching them learn more about Lent.



Courtney Boekelman does a wonderful job leading our 3rd/4th grade students. One of the Sundays in March, the students discussed 'Living By Faith'. In John 20: 24-31, they read about a man named Thomas, who had a hard time knowing what was true and false. As believers, we have to live by faith, not by sight. This was demonstrated with a science experiment and by making paper airplanes. Some people struggle to believe that God is real simply because they can't see him. When we sent out airplanes flying, we couldn't see the air, but it was the air that kept the planes soaring. Last Sunday, they made resurrection eggs, to tell the story of Easter.

Megan Holland is another asset to our education program and heads our 5th/6th Girls group. They are an impressive group that are full of questions and stories! Her focus this year has been to get them into the Bible, feel more comfortable with looking up and finding scripture. Then, how can we apply/use it in every day, life moments. Most months they have had a focus word, where they look up scripture, and listen to contemporary Christian songs that go with that word. October was 'words' – how powerful they are! November was 'thankful' – having an attitude of gratitude and showing thankfulness. March has been a review on the timeline of Holy week. The girls created Easter story stones to help them remember.

The 5th grade boys and girls have spent time with Pastor Eric in March as they prepare for the First Communion. We have many church members that make our education program as successful as it is, along with the kids that keep our program going!



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
