The meeting was called to order @ 6:07pm

- 1. Pastor Eric opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.
- 2. Secretary's Report
  - a. October minutes approved via email. Motion to approve by Susan, seconded by Patty.
- 3. Treasurer's Report We had discussion about the budget. We looked at a rough draft of where we're at and what we're looking at for next year. We reviewed the checkbook register as well.
  - a. Savings Account: \$584.27
  - b. Checking Account: \$7,450.70
  - c. Line of Credit: --
  - d. Special Projects Account: \$5,529.11

Motion to approve made by Amy, seconded by Kelsey.

- 4. Committee Reports
  - a. Technology

i. We appreciate the time and talents of Kyle Winter. We're also looking for anyone else who might be interested in stepping in when Kyle isn't available.

#### b. Property

- i. The roofer has been contacted regarding a permanent fix for the roof over the Sunday School rooms. After input from the congregation, the permanent fix was determined as the route to go. A temporary fix would still mean doing the permanent fix in the future. Estimate: \$6,500-\$7,500.
- ii. It was suggested to consider budgeting for a yearly maintenance check on the parsonage furnace and air conditioner.
- iii. The trim for the Nursery/Sunday School Rooms is in progress.

#### c. Worship

- i. The Worship Committee met on November 14th.
- ii. The Hanging of the Greens is being planned for November 27<sup>th</sup>.
- iii. We are planning two services on Christmas Eve a 4:00pm and 10:00pm.
- iv. There will be a 9:30am service on Sunday, Christmas Day.

#### d. Stewardship

- i. "Time and Talents" update. We plan to do a survey as a bulletin insert with the Hanging of the Greens Service. The survey will be included in the newsletter, and we plan to have an online version. We encourage people to return the survey in December. The church doesn't operate on a handful of people we need all hands on deck with whatever talents you can share!
- ii. The drive-thru Soup Supper fundraiser was a huge success! It brought in almost \$4000. Approximately 210 people were served.

#### e. Education

- i. Sunday School is getting ready for the Christmas program December 18 at 5:00pm. They are planning to serve a soup supper following the program for a freewill offering.
- ii. Sunday School Kids sing during the service on Sunday, November 20.
- iii. 1G going well. High School 1G started on November 2. Six students showed the first week, and 10 showed the second week. Hot meals are served for breakfast before school. The ministerial association is currently covering the cost of food.
- iv. Kelsey will be going off council but is willing to stay on as Sunday School Superintendent. We are looking to have a council member serve on education that Kelsey will work with.

#### g. Fellowship/Evangelism

- i. The Fall Luncheon served about 120 people and brought in \$1,643. This will be going to the Projects Fund for the roof repair.
- ii. The congregation is invited to a Giving Thanks Meal on November 20<sup>th</sup> at 4:30pm. Pastor Eric will have devotions at 5:30pm. We have MUCH to be thankful for!
- iii. Other upcoming ideas include:
  - \*Renting the Lake Mills Movie Theater when a good film comes out.
  - \*Offering a viewing of "The Chosen" at church on a Sunday.
  - \*Looking for activities or speakers that might be of interest to the younger families of our church, please contact Amy or Kim. We would love to reach out and serve those members of our congregation in a way that strengthens their Christian commitment.
  - \*Looking to get a group together to visit area nursing homes.
  - \*We might consider "Adopt a Classroom" for supplying snacks for Sunday School. Let Kim or Amy know if you are interested in supplying one of our classrooms.

#### 5. Pastor Report

- a. Third Graders received their bibles on October 16. Pastor led a class after worship about how to use their Bibles. He wants to have a strong push in Sunday School and Confirmation of using the Bible more and more.
- b. Four students were confirmed on October 30. Brendan, Andy, Alyssa, and Ashlyn
- c. All Saints Sunday was recognized on November 6 with the hanging of the doves and lighting candles in memory of loved ones who have passed.
- d. Carl and Ambre Waugh were married at Bethlehem on November 5.

- e. Henry David Lappe was baptized on November 6, and Ryder Ryan Paul on November 13.
- f. Pastor has been attending Fire Department meetings as the Chaplain. He plans to schedule some training after the new year.
- g. Timely Mission reopened to visitors on November 14. Pastor has worship on November 20.
- h. Pastor reported on the Iowa District Annual Gathering held in Clear Lake on November 12.
